### Take part



Since 2019, the Innovation Centre Linz has had an office in Pfarrgasse and the online platform <u>innovation.linz.at</u>, where citizens have the opportunity to help shape the city with constructive suggestions.



# Initial situation

- COVID, war, climate crisis today's young people are facing serious challenges.
  Rarely has the future been so uncertain, they are afraid, they are dystopian.
- Riots at Halloween 2022 in the center of the City of Linz

- Create your City! aims to rekindle courage and encourage positive thinking.
- The aim is to motivate young people (aged 11-20) to take part in social life and actively shape their city.



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# Initial situation

- One particular focus is on young people who are about to become eligible to vote (in Austria: at the age of 16).
- At the

Innovationshauptplatz, this group has the opportunity to participate digitally and take part in events and formats.  In cooperation with our project partner the 'Ministry for Curiosity and Future Studies', we are asking the questions:

What do you like about the city of Linz?

What would you like to change?

#### , It all starts in Linz'



The workshop begins in the foyer of the Old Town Hall, where an aerial photograph of the city is displayed on the floor, on which the pupils first locate themselves in response to questions such as 'Where is your school?', 'Where are you at home?', 'Which places in Linz do you particularly like, which ones not at all? And why?'



#### Practising municipal council



The workshop then moves to the municipal council chamber. After a brief introduction to the activities and composition of the municipal council, the participants work in small groups to develop arguments in favour of and against the city of Linz. Similar to a municipal council meeting, these are then debated in a panel discussion. Mayor Klaus Luger also takes time for the young people in the workshop.



For preparation and follow-up, participants also receive a brochure as accompanying material with links to videos of the City Sonate members and information on the workshop topics.


### **Developing ideas**



In the final part of the workshop, the problems identified serve as a basis for developing ideas on how the city of Linz can be made more liveable. The pupils are provided with various materials, from flipcharts to Lego, to visualise their ideas in the best possible way and present them to each other.



#### After the workshop



After the workshop, the ideas developed can be submitted to the participation platform via innovation.linz.at.

With sufficient support from the community, the proposals will then actually reach the relevant experts at Linz City Council and, depending on the possibilities, may even be implemented or even discussed in the real Linz City Council.





# Impact

- Young people show a remarkable openness to participation and a desire to actively make a difference and shape things. They want their voices to be heard and taken seriously.
- The feedback from the teachers is extremely positive, as they can observe changes in the pupils.

- Even those who were previously considered difficult take the format seriously and participate.
- The main aim of the project is to promote positive narratives and instil an optimistic mindset in young people.



# Impact

- No matter what age or type of school - the young people deal with similar topics every time: Affordable housing, mental health, social coexistence, environmental and climate protection, racism and diversity.
- They discuss these topics in depth and realise that political decisions affect their personal environment.

- The participation workshop is so popular that all dates in 2024 (the workshop takes place once a month) are already fully booked.
- By the end of 2024, over 500 young people will have taken part in Create your City.







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
