

About the European Capital of Democracy

Cities are incubators for democracy. They are best placed to safeguard and develop our self-government, protect the rule of law, and uphold human rights. To identify, address and interlink these spearheads of democratic innovation, we have launched the European Capital of Democracy initiative in 2021. By joining forces for democracy, these Cities share their expertise and their most innovative best practices in democracy promotion at the municipal level.



Each year, a new city is selected by over 4,000 Europeans (the members of the Citizens' Jury). Barcelona is the first ever European Capital of Democracy 2023/24, followed by the City of Vienna in 2024/25. The title-holding city becomes the central stage for strengthening and innovating democracy in Europe. All applicant cities join the European City Network to share their expertise and their most innovative best practices in democracy promotion at the municipal level.

The title-holding European Capital of Democracy hosts a year-long programme to celebrate democracy, showcase best practices and to address the central debates of our times. The aim is to establish a highly visible space where European citizens come together, get involved, experience new forms of democracy in action as well as draw inspiration from a wide range of formats designed to bring democracy forward and rebuild trust.

Together with citizens, institutions, civil society and businesses, the city curates and implements a variety of activities. Festivals, conferences, workshops, artistic interventions, participatory and deliberative processes— the city turns into a buzzing and engaging space, essential for our democratic future.





Being selected as European Capital of Democracy brings a wide range of benefits, such as an enhanced international reputation as a centre of democratic innovation and the opportunity to co-host prestigious flagship events like the Innovation in Politics Awards and the ACT NOW Mayors' Conference.

In order to compete for the title of European Capital of Democracy and to convince the Experts' and the Citizens' Jury, Cities have to submit a strong mission statement, a convincing selection of three proven and innovative Democracy Projects, and three pitches for new projects in the pipeline, to be presented and advanced further during the Democracy Year.





ECoD Barcelona team

The Programme Year 2023/24 was planned by a joint team of five persons from Barcelona City Council and the Metropolitan Strategic Plan of Barcelona (PEMB), in close collaboration with ECoD NPO and supported by local democracy expert Alexander as special envoy.

Barcelona unveiled its year-long programme as the European Capital of Democracy at the City Council's Saló de Cent in the presence of Mayor Jaume Collboni and with a significant address by Dubravka Šuica, Vice-President of the European Commission, who underscored the programme's importance and its alignment with democratic values, noting that cities like Barcelona are hotbeds of innovation.

To enrich the perspective on the annual program and related activities, an Advisory Committee has been formed that has met three times throughout the year, bringing together 22 institutions, relevant individuals, and associations like the Government of Catalonia, universities, or the Barcelona City and Youth Councils.

Participatory Projects



Manifesta Metropolitan Assembly

The Assembly is a metropolitan-scale deliberative citizen process that aimed to address the following questions:

- How can we create spaces in the metropolitan region that have a positive impact on culture?
- How can we do this while adopting a lifestyle that is more environmentally respectful?

It consists of 60 individuals chosen by lottery through prior registration and is linked to the Manifesta Biennial with the participation of 12 cities in the metropolitan region of Barcelona.

The objective of the Manifest Metropolitan Assembly was to explore and experiment with new spaces of governance and democratic processes in the development of cultural policies, as well as to foster collaboration on a regional scale.

Profiles of participants included independent artists and/or cultural managers, individuals from local social, cultural, and/or environmental organizations that are not exclusively from any of the 12 cities selected for the process, such as Badalona, Barcelona, Cornellà de Llobregat, El Prat de Llobregat, Granollers, L'Hospitalet de Llobregat, Mataró, Sabadell, Sant Adrià de Besòs, Santa Coloma de Gramenet, Sant Cugat del Vallès, and Terrassa.

This project is part of the European Capital of Democracy 2023-2024 and is organized by Manifesta 15 Barcelona in collaboration with the Barcelona Metropolitan Strategic Plan (PEMB).



Volem Decidir!

This was the first participatory process of the European Capital of Democracy which was aimed at boys and girls from 8 to 17 years in the city of Barcelona.

Proposals were collected around the questions:

- What topics do we want to participate in?
- How do we want to participate?

From January to June 2024, boys and girls had to decide which topics they considered to be priority and how they wanted to participate in the affairs of the city. The result had to be the creation of new forms and innovative participation spaces for children and adolescents who have been proposed during the process and enjoy greater support.

It was possible to participate in the process from primary and secondary schools, from childhood and adolescent facilities such as daycare centers, playhouses and open centres, and from leisure entities such as playgrounds or groups. It was also possible to participate through Decidim Barcelona which enabled the full participation of children from the age of 8.

Boys and girls who have participated in the workshops were able to present and debate their proposals in Ágoras located in public spaces in the city, in order to jointly debate with other centers or entities the proposals presented and reach a consensus.

From Decidim Barcelona all children and adolescents aged 8 to 17 could submit proposals, give their support and vote for the proposals they liked best.


The most voted proposals were presented to the City Council and its political representatives so that they can be put into practice. Finally, a committee made up of boys and girls participating in the process monitored the implementation of the proposals that the City Council undertook to carry out.

Highlight Events



The Innovation in Politics Awards 2024

Each year, The Innovation in Politics Awards highlight the most forward-thinking political projects across Europe, evaluated by a citizen jury of over 1,000 European citizens. In 2024, the Awards ceremony took place in Barcelona under the auspices of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe, Ms Marija Pejčinović Burić, and with the support of local partners, including The City of Barcelona, Generalitat de Catalunya and Diputació Barcelona.

The event brought together over 400 guests from 42 countries, including the Vice-President of the European Commission for Democracy and Demography, Ms. Dubravka Šuica, alongside government officials, politicians, ambassadors, and representatives from civil society and the private sector. Side events such as the Women's Brunch and Democracy Breakfast organised by the European Partnership for Democracy fostered further dialogue and networking among attendees.

During the event, finalists and guests exchanged innovative ideas on democracy, technology, education, local development, and more. Out of 334 projects from 26 countries, 314 met the awards criteria and were evaluated by the citizen jury. Of these, 70 finalists—ten per category—were recognized as trailblazers of innovation, with one project in each category winning the award. Notably, two initiatives from Barcelona City Council, B-MINCOME and Cooperative Housing, were recognized in the Social Cohesion and Local Development categories, respectively.

The Innovation in Politics Awards not only recognise outstanding projects but also promote cross-border collaboration and the exchange of best practices, encouraging innovative approaches to today's pressing challenges. Looking ahead, the next Innovation in Politics Awards ceremony will be held in Vienna, the European Capital of Democracy for 2024-2025, in autumn 2025.



Two projects by the Barcelona City Council, B-MINCOME and Housing Cooperatives, are finalists. B-MINCOME, which combines financial support with socio-labor inclusion to reduce poverty, is a finalist in the Local Development category.

Housing Cooperatives, a partnership with Sostre Cívic to promote cooperative housing under a leasehold model, is a finalist in the Social Cohesion category.

This is the 7th edition of the Innovation in Politics Awards and our core mission remains the same. While we are surrounded by people who believe in hate and aggression instead of co-existence and working together, the Awards showcase courage and optimism – and the outstanding people from politics and society who lead by example

Truth, Lies & Democracy

Truth, Lies & Democracy in Barcelona brought together six teams of European developers at the Canòdrom to create video games in defense of democracy and to combat disinformation.

Three local teams and three European teams participated for three days, from May 17 to 19, at the Canòdrom - Ateneu d'Innovació Digital i Democràtica, to develop video games and interactive proposals focused on fake news and disinformation. In its first edition held within the framework of the European Capital of Democracy, Truth Lies and Democracy gathered renowned professionals from the industries of games, technology, politics, and communication to offer talks and mentoring.

The initiative aims to educate players about the mechanisms of democratic decision-making, disinformation, fake news, privacy, and the impact of new technologies on society. Fake news represents a threat to democracy by undermining faith in elections, fostering distrust, minimizing confidence in journalism, and eroding trust in the government.

Fun facts



4,900 game studios in Europe



The project highlights the role of games in promoting European values and democracy. It positions video games as a medium for new generations to express how democracies must adapt to evolving cultural and political changes.

The inaugural edition of Truth, Lies & Democracy took place at the Canòdrom - Ateneu d'Innovació Digital i Democràtica, with the participation of three Spanish teams and three international teams traveling from France, Austria, and Denmark to join the pilot programme.



The event began on Friday, May 17, with an opening ceremony featuring a lecture by Ned Howey (cofounder of Tectonica) on the prevalence of fake news, its historicity, the ways in which the concept has expanded, how malicious misinformation spreads, and how we currently communicate and inform ourselves. Howey delved into the crisis of trust society is experiencing and how fake news capitalizes on this to thrive. Afterwards, the mentors introduced themselves, shared their experience in the fields of video games and journalism, and explored how video games and disinformation can be linked.

The closing of the event was led by the teams who took the stage to present the projects they intended to work on during the event.

Saturday morning began with individual mentoring sessions for each group led by Cristina Figueras (Verificat) and Claudia Ocaranza (Maldita.es), who provided their experience in the field of communication and fake news from two complementary approaches: research and education.

From there, the teams started working on the development of their video games, engaging in conversations and exchanges with the other mentors from the video game industry, which allowed them to refine details and resolve doubts in areas such as narrative, programming, production, and game design.

The European Capital of Democracy was the perfect environment to bring together policy-makers, academics, and practitioners to discuss the challenges our democracies face and the opportunities democratic innovations provide for revitalising democracy, when done well.

Decidim Fest

Decidim Fest is the international meeting of the Decidim platform and its entire community.

The Decidim platform already has two million users and is used in more than thirty countries around the world. This edition took place at the Canòdrom on October 18, 19 and 20 and was dedicated to democratic challenges and the limits of artificial intelligence applied to citizen participation.



This event addressed crucial questions about AI, such as its collective origin and regulation, and how it can be used to advance democracy and the common good. Decidim Fest is a global meeting point for the community that promotes free and democratic technology, contributing to a more democratic digital age.







ALDA Festival & General Assembly 2024

In the ever-changing landscape of local democracy, active citizenship, and global cooperation, ALDA emerged as a dynamic force. Through participative methodologies and decentralized cooperation, ALDA empowered local communities across Europe and beyond. Its mission to build bridges between local authorities and communities fostered dialogue and collaboration that transcended borders, positioning ALDA as a local facilitator with a global impact.

The ALDA Festival and General Assembly 2024, held from May 13 to 15 in Barcelona, Spain, marked a significant milestone in ALDA's journey. Aligned with the Barcelona European Capital of Democracy (ECoD) initiative.



Over the course of the three-day event, attendees engaged with key topics such as citizen participation, migration, gender equality, human rights, and youth involvement, all tied to ALDA's thematic hubs. The event also brought an international focus, covering regions like the Mediterranean, Africa, the Western Balkans, and Europe. Highlights included meetings with Barcelona students, thematic workshops, international events, and a captivating photo exhibition from Sarajevo.

Building on the success of the 2023 edition, which had drawn over 200 participants, the 2024 ALDA Festival and General Assembly further reinforced ALDA's commitment to creating a lasting global impact through local initiatives.

The 2024 Biennial of Thought

The fourth edition of the Biennial of Thought took place from October 8 to 13 under the topic "The Day After Everything." The event, organized by the Barcelona Institute of Culture, featured prominent figures from literature, science, sociology, and anthropology.

Among the participants were Herta Müller, Nobel Prize in Literature 2009; Wajdi Mouawad, Canadian playwright and writer of Lebanese origin; Zadie Smith, British writer and essayist; Oyèrónké Oyèwùmi, Nigerian feminist scholar specializing in African studies; Jason Hickel, economist and anthropologist; Perejaume, Catalan artist and poet; Begoña Román, philosopher and researcher, and Las hijas de Felipe, a duo of doctors in Baroque literature. The curation of the fourth edition of the Biennial of Thought was composed of Xavier Fina, Mar Rosàs, Raül Garrigasait, CCCB, and the European Capital of Democracy Barcelona team.





Closing Ceremony of the Programme Year 2023-2024 in Barcelona

The closing event marking the end of Barcelona's time as European Capital of Democracy took place within the Smart City Expo World Congress, showcasing a year of remarkable progress of democratic innovation in Europe. Over a 14-month period, Barcelona engaged 20,000 people through a diverse programme of 100 activities that spotlighted new democratic practices and public participation, leaving a lasting impact on democratic innovation across Europe.



During the closing, a panel titled "Ethics and Good Governance in 21st Century Europe" brought together esteemed experts. David Velázquez Vioque, former magistrate and Director of the Master in Compliance at ESADE Law School; Begoña Román Maestre, philosopher and ethics professor at the University of Barcelona, and President of the Ethics Committee of Social Services of Catalonia; and moderator Gemma Calvet i Barot, lawyer, consultant in transparency and good governance, engaged in a dialogue about the ethical dimensions of modern democratic governance.

The ceremony featured speeches by Lluís Rabell, City Councillor for the Neighborhood Plan, Education, Elderly People, and Participation at Barcelona City Council; Arnau Monterde, Director of Participation and Democratic Innovation at Barcelona City Council; André Sobczak, Secretary General of Eurocities; and Helfried Carl, founder of the European Capital of Democracy Initiative. A central moment of the event was the formal handover of the Capital of Democracy title to Vienna, represented by Jürgen Czernohorszky, Executive City Councillor for Climate, Environment, Democracy, and Personnel in Vienna.

The declaration signed between Barcelona and Vienna affirmed both cities' commitment to advancing democratic values, transparency, and citizen participation across Europe. This declaration highlighted the role of cities as hubs for democratic engagement and underscored the ongoing collaboration among European cities to support democratic resilience and innovation, setting a benchmark for future Capital of Democracy initiatives.



We take a broad view of democracy, and a "Democracy Project" is any initiative with encompasses one or more of the Dimensions of Democracy:



Community: Initiatives that celebrate cultural diversity, foster social cohesion, and protect local democracy through forward-thinking policies and long-term planning.

Participation: Projects that empower residents by providing them with tools to actively engage in decision-making processes.









Technology: Recognizing the transformative role of technology in the future of democracy. Digitalization brings both opportunities and challenges that must be thoughtfully addressed.

Empowerment: Strengthening democracy through education, training, and capacity-building for residents, public servants, and civil society. These projects help cities build strong partnerships with civil society, academia, and other key stakeholders.





Sustainability: Initiatives that drive international dialogue on climate change through democratic engagement, ensuring the process is people-driven, not technocratic.
