### Introduction and overview

Democracy delivers. Democracy is power to the people. Democracy is vibrant. Democracy is not just a form of government. It is a fundamental human right that ensures freedom, justice and equality for all members of our societies.

We created the European Capital of Democracy to show that democracy delivers for citizens. To celebrate ground-breaking innovation together with democratic front-runners, sharing best practices and learning from one another. Together with civil society and all citizens, they will help shape the future of European democracy.

Cities are incubators of and strongholds for democracy. As breeding grounds of democratic innovation, they bring together people from different backgrounds, creating a vibrant and dynamic public sphere that fosters democratic values and practices. They have the power to tackle big challenges, from climate action to social cohesion.

Every year, a different city is designated as European Capital of Democracy, creating a hub and stage for strengthening and innovating democratic practice in Europe and beyond. Our Citizens' Jury, a network of up to 4,000 engaged Europeans from 47 states, awarded the title for the first time to the City of Barcelona. In November 2024, Barcelona passed the torch to Vienna, the next European Capital of Democracy.

### About ECoD NPO

ECoD gemeinnützige GmbH (ECoD NPO) was founded in 2021 by The Innovation in Politics Institute GmbH, an independent and non-partisan organisation that identifies, develops and implements innovations in the private and public sector in order to strengthen democracy in Europe.

As a non-profit organisation, ECoD NPO's mission is to promote democratic governance and to strengthen social cohesion by fostering and expanding participation and awareness across the Council of Europe member states.

For this purpose, a European Capital of Democracy is designated every year, starting with Barcelona in 2023/24 and Vienna in 2024/25. In cooperation with civil society and citizens, the designated city will curate, organise, and implement a Programme Year, featuring a wide range of activities and events. Visitors from all over Europe are invited to join and to participate.

To ensure long term societal benefits, ECoD NPO focuses on

#### Participation

Participation projects enable citizens to play an active role in decision-making processes. This strengthens citizens' sense of identity, as well as society's awareness of and confidence in democratic principles.

#### Future orientation and technology

Rapidly developing technology will profoundly shape the future of democracy. The opportunities presented by digitisation are infinite – and so are the challenges it poses. That's why ECoD NPO focuses on future generations by promoting education, participation and digital literacy among children and young people.

#### Sustainability

Sustainability projects aim to foster an international discourse, supporting citizens and cities in ensuring that radical climate transformation is a democratic process, and not just a technocratic one.

The objectives of ECoD NPO are achieved through a variety of activities:

- Events like conferences, panels and workshops
- Competitions and awards for outstanding democratic achievements
- Promotion of networking and knowledge exchange in support of relevant democratic and (civil) society actors via networks and platforms
- Supporting and enabling participatory and decision-making processes, e.g. with the Citizens' Jury, a Europe-wide network of democracy defenders
- Publishing electronic and printed media of various kinds





ECoD NPO's office is located in Vienna, Austria, with an international team and a network of partners in many European countries. Our organisation is driven by a diverse team of nine employees, including founder Helfried Carl and CEO Stefan Sindelar. An **Advisory Board** serves as an independent sounding board for ECoD NPO and contributes by providing the experience and know-how of its members. It provides advice, suggestions and recommendations regarding the Democracy Year and the further development of the initiative. An **Experts' Jury** - made up of highly respected experts and practitioners in the field of academia, civil society, arts, and business - assesses the level of ambition, innovation and creativity of democracy projects based on the fair and transparent selection. The **Citizens' Jury, a network of over 4,500 engaged citizens,** selects the next European Capital of Democracy (see "Citizens' Jury").

All Cities that submit a full application will be admitted to the **European City Network** (see "European City Network"), a strong group of 24 Cities from 15 European countries, providing best practice exchange, access to experts, the possibility of participating and showcasing in the ECoD Programme Year, and access to

- exchange & peer-learning
- tailored programmes, trainings & capacity building
- project cooperation as ECoD partners

The necessary **financial resources** are raised through public and private fundraising, including European Institutions, donations, sponsoring, legacies, and other contributions, such as income from events and business activities necessary for the achievement of ECoD NPO's purpose (e.g. income from consulting, the granting of licences and rights of use, and the production and distribution of products or services).





## Citizens' Jury

The Innovation in Politics Institute's¹ successful experiences with citizens' juries - the credibility of the evaluation process, the outstanding quality of the results and their broad acceptance - encourages us to expand this instrument and use it with a broader range of effects. To this end, a Citizens' Jury of currently over 4,500 people has been established in 47 European countries.

Social innovation is the answer to burning issues of our time: a lack of participation and exchange, eroding social cohesion, and even an armed conflict in the heart of Europe. The Citizens' Jury aims to foster open dialogue and to support municipalities, cities, states and European institutions in finding functioning solutions to involve citizens. Complex decisions, the crowdsourcing of tasks and qualitative feedback on multi-layered topics require a completely new approach.

The Citizens' Jury is a prototypical, NPO and NGO-driven advancement of the Conference on the Future of Europe (CoFoE), which has revealed the urgent need of citizens' engagement and the hitherto non-existing technological possibilities. It covers a broader geographical scope of action, a higher number of involved citizens, provides a platform for further exchange, and countless opportunities to engage and connect.

Over 4,500 Citizens' Jurors from all CoE member states and Kosovo select a European Capital of Democracy every year and serve as a unique sounding board and network for social issues such as participation, democracy, sustainability and intergenerational justice forms. This network creates completely new opportunities for citizen participation and social research. An online, mobile-first platform will serve as a central hub for information, activation, exchange and participation in surveys and votes.

In January 2023, the members of the Citizens' Jury selected Barcelona to become the very first European Capital of Democracy. Vienna has taken over in November 2024. Building on the learnings from the first two editions, we are building a community and preparing an exchange platform. Furthermore, the Citizens' Jurors are invited to select their level of participation, preferred communication channels and activities.

To get things started, we hosted online capacity building workshops together with Alliance4Europe and coordinated the selection and training of 50+ change-makers for the European Elections together with ALDA Europe and partners in seven European countries. Since October 2023, selected representatives from our ECoD City Network host monthly information sessions ("Cities learn" and "Cities teach" webinars) on current topics - see "European City Network".

## European City Network (ECN)

The European Capital of Democracy initiative has built a strong network of twenty-four cities that fosters participation and provides a platform for cities to showcase how we can change our world for the better. Representatives of the cities come together regularly to share their expertise and best practices in democracy promotion at the municipal level.

#### Our twenty-four City Network members come from fifteen countries across Europe:

Antwerp (BE), Barcelona (ES), Bologna (IT), Braga (PT), Bratislava (SK), Brussels (BE), Burgos (ES), Cascais (PT), Durrës (AL), Gdańsk (PL), İzmir (TR), Kraków (PL), Kyiv (UA)<sup>2</sup>, Leipzig (DE), Linz (AT), Metz (FR), Opole (PL), Rotterdam (NL), Rzeszów (PL), Sarajevo (BiH), Sofia (BG), Tirana (AL), Valongo (PT), and Vienna (AT).

#### **European City Network members benefit from:**

- **Collaboration:** Network members host regular in-person meetings, as well as online workshops, which foster and strengthen pan-European collaboration.
- **Training:** Knowledge sharing, peer learning and capacity building enables our members to gather new skills and provides opportunities for professional development.
- Access: International expertise for mutual exchange of knowledge and experience, as well as ECoD Programme Year events to showcase their work.
- **Exchange:** Sharing best practices creates a supportive environment which inspires the development of impactful interventions in their communities.
- **Participation:** Contribute and be a part of the Programme Year in the title-holding ECoD City, as well as the online and in-person City Network meetings.

The ECN is an exclusive group of dedicated cities that are frontrunners in democracy promotion. All participating cities have successfully submitted applications for the ECoD Call. Cities nominate representatives from departments dealing with questions of democracy and civic participation who actively participate in network activities.

There are three types of activities:

#### 1. Physical Workshops: "Cities meet"

3-day long City Network Meetings focus on the host city's field of expertise. They consist of an interactive mix of workshops, field trips, and exchange with local organisations and stakeholders, plus networking opportunities.

#### 2. Online Meetings: "Cities teach"

90-minute long webinars in which 3 member cities of the ECN present their best practices in the topic field to a wider audience. Outline: Introduction, best-practice presentations, breakout sessions (3 in parallel), and a summary with the whole group.

60-minute long webinars with external experts, proposed by the host city. Outline: Introduction, experts' input, followed by Q&A.

- Antwerp (Belgium): Youth participation

- Bologna (Italy): Diversity & inclusion

### Selected activities in 2024

ECoD NPO was established in December 2021 to prepare and implement the European Capital of Democracy initiative. In accordance with the organisation's purpose (to promote democratic governance, strengthen social cohesion by promoting and expanding democratic participation and awareness, and by strengthening established and new forms of democratic practice in Europe), activities have included the following highlights.

### January

• Final meeting and submission of the "SCALEDEM" Horizon Europe project proposal, which was accepted later in the year. Democratic innovations, whether participatory, digital, or deliberative, have proliferated in recent years thanks to more than 300 transnational projects involving researchers, civil society organizations, and public authorities. However, despite these experiments, knowledge about their scalability and political impact remains limited. SCALEDEM aims to overcome these challenges by helping to disseminate these innovations beyond experimental projects. • Implementation of the TALE - Take the Lead in EU Elections project under the lead of ALDA Europe (https://www.alda-europe.eu/tale-take-the-lead-in-the-eu-elections/) together with foster europe (https://www.foster-europe.org/), aimed to reach and engage a greater number of voters, reduce the gap of voters turnout among the various EU member states, and, through participatory processes, activate and empower them to play an active role and thus vote in the European parliamentary elections in 2024.

She presented the City of Brussels' use of a cargo bike to reach citizens where they are, thus lowering the threshold for engagement. <u>Tiago Koch</u>, <u>from the Environment Division of the Municipality of Valongo</u>, presented the BiodiverCities project which aims to tackle the urban heat-island effect and promote and support biodiversity. <u>Katharina Toth</u>, <u>Energy Planning Consultant for the Vienna Climate Team of the City of Vienna</u>, gave us an overview of the Vienna Climate Team process, focussing on the Citizens' Jury.
- ECN Brussels, 25 27 March, <u>Cities Meet: Tackling social and climate challenges with Brussels' solutions</u>: 30 representatives from ECN member cities were able to explore how Brussels formulates its public policies through close consultation with citizens and stakeholders across various sectors. Jessica (Ika) Trijsburg, Research Fellow in City Diplomacy at the Melbourne Centre for Cities, presented the findings of a collaborative research project she led, looking into how cities connect and collaborate to address shared and complex challenges, in this case, disinformation. Paul Costello, Senior Programme Manager for the German Marshall Fund's Cities Programme (Berlin Office), reviewed the 10 principles that resulted from the collaborative research project. Graham Wetherall-Grujić, Lead Expert for Democracy Technologies at the Innovation in Politics Institute, discussed a notorious example of misinformation against green energy in Germany. Mathis Dippon, Democracy Year Manager at European Capital of Democracy NPO, presented Truth, Lies & Democracy –a key format in the European Capital of Democracy's Democracy Year events.

### Communication and dissemination

In order to publicise European Capital of Democracy as widely as possible, media partnerships with EURACTIV and The European Correspondent and cooperations with 25+ Europe-wide organisations, including Alliance4Europe, have been formed. A cooperation Agreement with the DG COMM at European Parliament has been started for the European Elections 2024 and is set to be prolonged.

In continuation of the long-time patronage of both the Vice-President of the European Commission - Democracy and Demography, Dubravka Šuica, and the Secretary General of the Council of Europe, Marija Pejčinović Burić, we formalised a cooperation with the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities, Secretary General Mathieu Mori and Director Claudia Luciani.
